

"Canon" Claim, St. Helens Mining District.

Notice of location of Quartz Mining Claim.

Notice is hereby given that W. A. Reynolds, David Stewart, and E. M. Lauman, citizens of the United States, over twenty one years of age at the time hereinafter mentioned, on the 25th day of August 1899, discovered a vein or lode of quartz, or rock in place, bearing gold, copper, and other valuable minerals, and on the same day relocated said vein or lode by the name of Canon Lode, and under the laws and in accordance with the laws of the United States and of the State of Washington, and said parties claim the said vein, or lode and every part of the same with surface ground Three hundred feet in width on each side of the center line of said vein or lode and fifteen in length on each side of said center line of the said vein or lode, beginning at discovery point hereinafter described and running thence south by about 18° east for said 1500 feet on each side of said center line, said course being the general direction of the said vein or lode. The whole of said location is supposed to have been previously located, but the same at date of the relocation herein described wholly abandoned property. The said Canon Lode is an extension of the Summit Lode. The following is a description of the beginning point of the said Canon Lode, the same by which the same is located, viz: -

Beginning point of said lode or vein is about midway of a long cascade and near to the lower entrance to a gorge of the hereinafter described stream and is about eight, to fifteen feet west of the south side of a certain fir tree 8 to 14 inches in diameter on the east bank of said stream, which tree discoverers blazed or squared on four sides, and on which the discovery notice was written August 25th, 1899 the date of discovery and location. Said creek or stream is the first one west of the trail at Shaper's pass and at Discovery is not far from 1000 feet west of said trail. Said pass is the one over the divide separating the head of the north fork of Puget, sometimes called Green river, and the said stream on which is located the said Canon lode, the waters of which stream flow southward from discovery and are discharged into the upper end of Spirit Lake. Said claim has been marked on the ground, is 1500 feet in length on each side of the center line of said claim beginning at discovery and running southward by about 18° east; as aforesaid and is in the St. Helens Mining District, Shomona County, Washington.
