

"Red Company Mine" Claim, St. Helens Mining District.

Notice of Location of Quartz Claim.

Notice is hereby given that the undersigned, who are citizens of the United States, having complied with the requirements of Chapter Six of Title Thirty-two of the Revised Statutes of the United States and the local customs, laws and regulations, have this day located and claim 1500 linear feet along the course of this lead, lode or vein of mineral-bearing quartz, and 300 feet in width on each side of said lead, lode or vein, together with all mineral deposits contained therein, and all timber growing within the limits of said claim, and all water or water privileges therein or appurtenant thereto, situated in St. Helens Mining District, Shamania County, State of Washington, and more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at discovery on a small stream on a mountain-side opposite to and about one half mile to the east of, and about 300 feet below, shaffers pass and about three quarters of a mile above the so called north West Extension of the Chicago Mine claim and said stream flows into the north Fork of the Tumble River opposite the mouth of a small stream on which is located the Juniata Mine claim location discovery, and said claim about 1200 feet from the mouth of said stream and extends 1500 feet in a North-westerly direction and 300 feet on each side of said vein and adjoins the Titile Company Mine claim, and is a relocation of the so called Old Dodd Mine claim which has been abandoned since 1896, and shall be known as the Red Company Mine claim.
