

"Red Robe Mine Claim, St. Helens Mining District.

Notice of Location of Quartz Claim.

Notice is hereby given that the undersigned, who are citizens of the United States, having complied with the requirements of Chapter Six of Title Thirty-Two of the Revised Statutes of the United States and the local customs, laws and regulations, have this day located and claim 1500 feet along the course of the lead, lode or vein, together of mineral-bearing quartz, and 300 feet in width on each side of said lead, lode or vein, together with all mineral deposits contained therein, and all timber growing within the limits of said claim, and all water or water privilege thereon or appurtenant thereto, situated in St. Helens Mining District, Skamania County, State of Washington, and more particularly described as follows:- Bounding:

Beginning at discovery on a small stream on a mountain-side opposite it and about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile to the east of Shaffer Pass, and about 300 feet lower down and about $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile above the so-called Northwest Extension of the Chicago Mine claim, and said stream follows flows into the North fork of the Toutle River opposite the mouth of a small stream on which is located the Juncula Mine claim location discovery and about 1200 feet from the mouth of said stream and extends 1500 feet in a South Easterly direction and 300 feet on each side of said vein and adjoins the White Company Mine claim and is a relocation of the Old Wood Mine abandoned in the year 1896, names of parties unknown, as shall be known as the Red Robe Mine claim.
