

Suzette Mine claim, St. Helena Mining District

Notice of Location of Lurey claim.

Notice is hereby given that the undersigned, who are citizens of the United States having complied with the requirements of Chapter Six of Title Two of the Revised Statutes of the United States and the local customs, laws and regulations, have this day located and claim 1500 linear feet along the course of this lead, lode or vein of mineral bearing quartz and 300 feet in width on each side of said lead, lode or vein, together with all mineral deposits contained therein and all timber growing within the limits of said claim and all water or water privileges thereon or appurtenant thereto. Situate in the St. Helena Mining District, Harmania County, and State of Washington and described as follows, - to-wit:

Beginning at discovery on a small creek flowing into the North Fork of the Toutle River near the Turnell face of the Juniata Mine claim and about 20 rods above the Juniata mine cabin and about 30 feet from the trail about $\frac{3}{8}$ of a mile below Sheppers Pass and about 300 feet from the N. Westly end of the Juniata mine claim and extends 200 feet in a North Westly direction 18° W. of North or thereabouts, and about 300 feet in a South Eastly direction to the Juniata mine claim and extends the Juniata mine claim, and said claim is 300 feet in width on each side of the center of said claim and fifteen hundred feet in length. Discovered August 16, 1899 and located August 16, 1899 the said claim to be called the Suzette Mine claim.
