NOTICE IS HEREBY Given that Central Pacific Lumber Company, an Oregon corporation, claims a lien upon a quantity of timber and trees being about one thousand trees in quantity and number, which were cut or manufactured in Skamania County, State of Washington, and have not yet been cut into saw logs or piling lengths, and are now marked, but are lying in and upon

The North  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the northwest  $\frac{1}{4}$  and the southwest  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the northwest  $\frac{1}{4}$  of section 23 township 3 north of range 9, east of the Willamett Meridian,

for stumpage due thereon from Louis Pearson, doing business as the Pearson Logging & Lumber Company, pursuant to a contract made and entered into by and between the Central Pacific Lumber Company, the claimant herein, and said Pearson, on the 8th day of January, 1929, under which said Pearson agreed to pay stumpage on said timber at the following rates: For Merchantable piling on all pieces 12 inches in diameter and under, 1¢ per lineal foot; for merchantable piling on all pieces of 12 inches at the butt, 2¢ per lineal foot; on all merchantable saw logs, \$2.00 per thousand feet; that the name of the owners or reputed owners of said timber and trees cut as aforesaid, is Louis Pearson, doing business as the Pearson Logging & Lumber Company, and Pearson Logging & Lumber Co., Inc., a corporation; that said Louis Pearson, doing business as the Pearson Logging & Lumber Company, as aforesaid, was authorized or employed by the central Pacific Lumber Company, to cut said timber upon the following terms and conditions: That said Louis Pearson agreed to pay the said Central Pacific Lumber Company for said timber, at the rate of 1¢ per lineal foot for all piling under 12 inches in diameter at the butt, and 2¢ for all piling over 12 inches in diameter at the butt per lineal foot, and \$2.00 per thousand for merchantable saw logs; that 1000 trees have been cut by said Pearson and said Pearson Logging & Lumber Co., Inc., during the period beginning January 8th, 1929, and ending on the 25th day of February, 1929 on or about which date the cutting of said timber ceased; that thirty (30) days have not elapsed since that time; that the amount of claimant's demand for stumpage under said contract for timber and trees so felled, is \$1200.00; that no part thereof has been paid; that there is now due and remaining unpaid for stumpage on said trees and timber, after deducting all just credits and offsets, the sum of \$1200.00, in which amount the Central Pacific Lumber Company claims a lien upon said trees and timber. The said Central Pacific Lumber Company also claims a lien upon all machinery and equipment now owned by said Louis Pearson or said Pearson Logging & Co. Inc., to secure payment for the stumpage now due on the trees, logs and timber herein described.
