To all to whom these presents shall come Greeting:

Whereas John G. Fleming of Skamania County Washington Territory has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Vancouver Washington Territory whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said John G. Fleming. According to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 24th of April 1820 entitled an act making further provisions for the sale of the Public Land and the acts Supplemental thereto for the North East quarter of the South West quarter and the South half or the South west quarter of section thirty two in Township two North of Range five east of Williamette Meridian in Washington Territory containing one hundred and twenty acres.

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According to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands returned to the General Land office by the Survey or General which said tract has been purchased by the said John G. Fleming. Now know ye that the United States of America in consideration of the premises and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided have given and granted and by these presents do give and grant unto the said John G. Fleming and to his heirs the said tract above described. To have and to hold the same together with all the rights, privileges immunities and appurtenances of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging unto the said John G. Fleming and to his heirs and assigns forever subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining ~~agricultural~~ agricultural, Manufacturing or other purposes and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, laws and decisions of courts and also subject to the right of the proprietor of a vein or lode to extract and remove

his ore therefrom should the same be found to penetrate or intersect the premises hereby granted as provided by law In testimony whereof I, Chester A. Arthur President of the United States of America have caused the letters to be made patent and the seal of the General land office to be hereunto affixed given under my hand at the city of Washington the fifteenth day of January in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty four and of the independence of the United States the one hundred and eighth.
