CERTIFICATE NO. 1036.

Whereas George J. Stevenson of Clark County Washington Territory has deposited in the General Land Office of the United State a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Vancouver Washington Territory whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said George J. Stevenson according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 24 of April 1820 intituled an act making further provisions for the sale of the public Lands for The North West Quarter of the South West quarter of Section thirty-two in Township two north of Range five east in the district of Lands subject to sale at Vancouver, Washington Territory containing forty acres.

According to the Official plat of the Survey of the said Lands returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General which said tract has been purchased by the said George J. Stevenson. Now Know Ye that the United States of America in consideration of the premises and in conformity with the Several acts of Congress in such case made and provided have given and granted and by these presents Do give and grant unto the said George J. Stevenson and to his heirs the said tract above described to have and to hold the same together with all the rights privileges immunities and appurtenances of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging unto the said George J. Stevenson and to his heirs and assigns forever.

Grant, President of the United States of America have caused the Letters to be made patent and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed Given under my hand at the City of Washington the tenth day of May in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy and of the Independence of the United States the ninety fourth, By the President U.S. Grant


