Whereas there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Vancouver Washington Territory whereby it appears that pursuant to the act of Congress approved 20th May 1862 to secure Homestead to actual Letters on the Public Domain and acts supplemental thereto the claim of George J. Stevenson has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law for the South east quarter of Section thirty one in Township to North of Range five East in the District of Lands subject of sale at Vancouver Washington Territory containing one hundred and sixty acres.

According to the Official Part of the Survey of the said Land Returned to the General Land Office by the Survey or General. Now know ye that there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said George J. Stevenson the tract of land above described to have and to hold the said tract of land with the appurtenances thereof unto the said George J. Stevenson and to his heirs and assigns forever subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining agricultural, manufacturing or other purposes and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, Laws and decisions of courts and also subject to the right of the proprietor of a vein or lode to extract and remove his ore therefrom should the same be found to penetrate or intersect the premises hereby granted as provided by law.
