Do make publish and declare this my last willand ~~make~~ testament that is to say first I direct ~~th~~ ~~make~~ that all my just debts and funeral expences be fully paid and satisfied by my executors hereinafter named as soon as conveyiently may be after my decease: Second, I give grant and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary J. Hamilton all the Property real personal or mixed of whatever name or nature of which I shall die, seized or prossessed or to which I shall be entitled at the time of my decease, to be held used and enjoyed by her for and during her life time and upon her death to our children in equal shares and in case of the death of any of them having children the share or shares to which they would be entitled to if living shall descend to them said children share and share alike. In case I should survive my said wife I direct that all my property aforesaid be devided among our said children in the manner aforesaid their own use benefit and behoof forever. Third: I do hereby nnominate and appoint my said wife Mary J. Hamilton the executrix of this my last will and testament who shall act without bond but in case she should die before I do then I nominate and appoint my oldest son Jason A. Hamilton executor hereof.

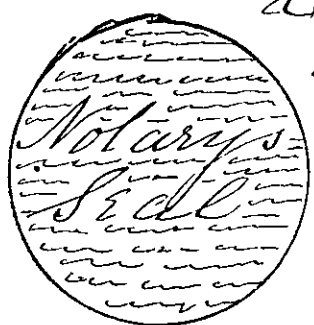
