

"Rounes" Claim. Bald Mountain Mining District

Notice of Amended Location of Quartz Mining Claim.

Notice is hereby given that J. Jonathan Rounes Jr., a citizen of the United States, having complied with the requirements of the laws of the United States and of the State of Washington, and the local customs, laws and regulations, have located, and claim by virtue of the original discovery and location and this amended certificate, of location Fourteen hundred and fifteen (1415) linear feet on this the East Ekana lode of mineral bearing quartz, and Three hundred (300) feet in width on each side of the center of said lode, together with all mineral deposits contained therein, and all timber growing within the limits of said claim, and all water and water privileges thereon or appurtenant thereto. This claim is situated in the Bald Mountain Mining District, in the County of Skamania, State of Washington, and is now and shall be known as the "Rounes" Mining Claim.

The general course of said lode is South 60° East and I claim in length on said lode Fourteen hundred and fifteen (1415) feet Southeasterly from the point of discovery, at which point I have posted an original duplicate of this notice. I have marked the surface boundaries of this claim by placing substantial posts not less than three feet high and four inches in diameter at each corner of said claim, bearing the name of the lode and of the claim and the date of location, and have cut the brush and marked and blazed the trees along the lines of said claim to indicate the location of said lines.

The surface boundary of this claim is particularly described as follows, to wit:

Beginning at a post in a mound of stone at the Northwest corner of said claim. Said post is one thousand and two (1002) feet North and seventeen hundred fifty one and one half (1751½) feet West of the Southwest corner of Section numbered Twenty Eight (28) in Township Three (3) North Range Five (5) East of the Tillamette Meridian. Thence South 60° East Fourteen hundred and fifteen (1415) feet; thence South $40^{\circ} 15'$ West six hundred (600) feet; thence North 60° West Fourteen hundred and fifteen (1415) feet; thence North $40^{\circ} 15'$ East, six hundred (600) feet to the place of beginning.

I do intend to hold and work said above described claim as provided by the laws of the United States and of the State of Washington.

This is an amended location of the Bourne claim, discovered by D. J. Lawton on the 12th day of June 1895, and located on the 12th day of June 1895, and recorded at page 45 of Book "B" of Miscellaneous Records of Okanogan County, Washington, I now being the owner of said claim by purchase and conveyance from said original locator.

This amended certificate of location is made without waiver of any rights previously acquired by me by virtue of said original location, purchase and conveyance, and for the purpose of correcting any errors in the original location, description or record of said claim, and of taking in any additional ground which is subject to location, and any part of any overlapping claim which has been abandoned.
