NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the State of Washington through its Department of Labor and Industries claims a lien prior to all other liens, except taxes, upon any and all of the real estate, plant, works, equipment and buildings improved, operated or constructed by the above named employer and also upon any and all logs, spars, piles, ties and any and all other timber produced, and any and all articles manufactured by said above named employer, which property is now located in the County of Skamania, State of Washington, and is more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

Two Donkey Engines and other logging equipment; logs bucked and fell on premises known as the T. J. Vail Place and Camas Tract in Section 6 Township One (1) North Range Six (6) East of the W. M., Also, logs in boom or rafts and adjacent thereto in the Columbia River, all said property being near Prindle, Skamania County, Washington.

One of the above described donkey engines is further described as being A Tacoma Yarder No. 1354, 12½ x 12 with sled and appurtenances as shown by mortgage given by the Columbia Logging Company to Deer Island Logging Company under No. 15865 of the records of the county Auditor of Skamania County, recorded August 7, 1929.

This lien is upon, and to secure the payment of, an account of and for industrial insurance and medical aid premiums or assessments and penalties due the industrial insurance and medical aid funds of the State of Washington, all of which aggregate One hundred & 79/100 dollars (\$100.79) Dollars, and all of which were incurred under and by virtue of the operations of said employer in which workmen were employed under the provisions of section 7673 to 7796 inclusive, of Remington's Compiled Statutes.

This lien shall date from the commencement of the labor for and on account of which said premiums or assessments and penalties are due, to-wit: October 1st to October 31st, 1929.

The said employer made report to the Department of Labor and Industries of his pay rolls upon said operations and defaulted in the payment of said premiums or assessments due thereon upon the 16th day of November, 1929, and ever since said last mentioned date has been and now is in default to said State of Washington for said account, which is more particularly set forth as follows, to-wit:
