Notice is hereby given, that G. M. Parker, G. M. Parker, Jr., and D.W. Connelly, residents of Clark County, State of Washington, have and claim a lien upon a quantity of saw logs being approximately 350,000 feet located and now lying in the woods on the following described tracts of land located in Skamania County, State of Washington, to-wit:

East half of Lot eleven (11) in section twenty-five, township two (2) north, range six (6) east of the Willamette Meridian; south half of the southeast quarter of the southwest quarter of section twenty-four (24) township two (2) north, range six (6) east of the Willamette Meridian;

and also, upon a quantity of saw logs being about 30,000 feet, which have been hauled from the woods and are now in a boom or raft tied in the Columbia River at or near the Station of Cascade in Skamania County, State of Washington.

That claimants commenced cutting said logs and performing labor upon said logs, for which this lien is claimed, on the 24th day of April, 1931, and ceased cutting said logs and performing labor thereon, on the 29th day of May, 1931. That said claimants claim this lien upon the logs as above described, being all fir logs, for labor performed and assistance rendered in falling and bucking said logs, and the name of the owners or reputed owners of said logs are H. C. Freads, Cecil S. Gupzell, F. E. Westerberg and George Westerberg, and that said H. C. Freads employed said claimants to perform said labor upon the following terms and condition, to-wit:

That said H. C. Freads agreed to pay the said claimants the sum of Ninety cents per thousand for all the logs which they fell and bucked for these said parties and that the three claimants working together fell and bucked during the time as above set forth, a total of 350,000 feet of said logs, which at the agreed price per thousand would amount to the total sum of \$315.00 and one-third of which amount would go to each of said claimants. That said claimants truly and duly performed all of the terms and conditions of their said contract of employment. That thirty days have not elapsed since the date of the last performance of said labor by each of said claimants and that there is now due and owing said claimants the sum of \$315.00, no part of which has been paid and in which amount the said claimants claim a lien upon said logs now owned by the said H. C. Freads; Cecil S. Gupzell; F. E. Westerberg and George Westerberg, partners. That there is some sort of an arrangement between all of said parties upon said logs wherein and whereby the said H. C. Freads was was to cut the timber from the land of Cecil S. Gupzell and to place the logs in a boom or raft and the said F. E. Westerberg and George Westerberg, partners, were to raft and sell said logs and divide the proceeds in some way as they should agree but just what said agreement was or is, is not known to these claimants.

Notice is hereby given that Charles Kirkpatrick of Clark County, Washington, claims a lien upon a quantity of saw logs, being about 266,455 feet in quantity, which were cut in Skamania County, Washington, 204,743 feet being upon the property of Cecil S. Guptill in Section 25 Township 2 of Range 6 East of the Willamette Meridian in Skamania County, Washington, and 61,712 feet of which are in the possession of the Johnson Mill in Portland, Oregon, for labor performed upon and assistance rendered in hauling said logs; that the name of the owner or reputed owner of said logs is George Westberg; that one H. C. Freds, sometimes known as H. C. Freds, employed said Charles Kirkpatrick to perform such labor and render such assistance upon the following terms and conditions, to-wit:

The said Freds agreed to pay the said Kirkpatrick for such labor and assistance the sum of \$2.00 per thousand for all logs hauled and that the said Charles Kirkpatrick hauled 61,712 feet or a total of \$123.42; that in addition, said Charles Kirkpatrick hauled logging machinery for said Freds used in the cutting and hauling of said logs, upon which there is due the sum of \$100.00, making a total due of \$223.42; that said contract has been faithfully performed and fully complied with on the part of said Charles Kirkpatrick, who performed labor upon and assisted in hauling said logs; that said labor and assistance were so performed and rendered upon said logs and machinery between the 25th day of May, 1931, and the 21st day of June, 1931; that the rendition of said services was closed on the 21st day of June, 1931, and that thirty days have not elapsed since that time; that no part thereof has been paid and there is now due and remaining unpaid thereon, after deducting all just credits and offsets, the sum of \$223.42, in which amount he claims a lien upon said logs.
