Notice is hereby given that the State of Washington through its Department of Labor and Industries claims a lien prior to all other liens, except taxes, upon any and all of the real estate, plant, works, equipment and buildings improved, operated or constructed by the above named employer and also upon any and all logs, spars, piles, ties and any and all other timber produced, and any and all articles manufactured by said above named employer, which property is now located in the county of Skamania State of Washington and is more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

200,000 feet of logs, steam donkey engine with equipment located on the Cecil Guptaill place East 1/2 of Lot 11 Section 25, township 2 North range 6 East W. M. and South 1/2 of SE 1/4 of S.W. 1/2 Section 24, township, 2 north, range 6 East W. M. Skamania County, Wa. h.

This lien is upon, and to secure the payment of, an account of and for industrial insurance and medical aid premiums or assessments and penalties due the industrial insurance and medical aid funds of the State of Washington, all of which aggregate one-hundred fifty-two hundreds (\$150.26) Dollars, and all of which were incurred under and by virtue of the operations of said employer in which workmen were employed under the provisions of sections 7673 to 7696 inclusive, of Remington's Compiled Statutes.

Notice is hereby given That F. M. Fowler of Skamania County, State of Washington, claims a lien upon a quantity of saw logs branded JED, being about 250,000 feet in quantity, which logs were cut or manufactured in Skamania County, State of Washington, and were cut from Section Nine (9), Township Three (3) North, Range Nine (9) East of the Willamette Meridian, and which are now rafted in three brails and lying in Skamania County, Washington, in what is known as Drano lake, or the mouth of the Little White Salmon river; also claimant claims a lien upon one certain logging donkey engine, size 10 x 12, manufactured by Puget Sound, Iron & Steel Works, together with its blocks, lines, sled, equipment, etc., said donkey engine now being located on the northeast quarter of said section 9, township 3, north, range 9 EWM., Skamania County, Wash.

That the name of the owner or reputed owner of said logs and of said donkey engine is J. E. Rogers.

That the lien claimed is for labor performed by said claimant upon and assistance rendered in connection with the manufacture of said logs in the logging camp and in building roads and otherwise being employed in the woods by the said J. E. Rogers.

That the labor and assistance rendered by claimant has been faithfully performed and fully complied with, and that said labor and services are reasonably worth the sum of \$4.00 per day, and heard.

That the claimant began to work in the month of March, 1931, and continued to work until the 14th day of October, 1931, when his employment ceased. That he worked a total of 210 days earning the total sum of \$840.00 upon which there has been paid \$76.50 leaving a balance due of \$763.50 which is the amount claimant now demands for services rendered and upon which he claims a lien against the logs and donkey engine above described. That no part has been paid excepting the sum above specified and all of said sum of \$763.50 is now due and owing.
