Notice is hereby given That F. M. Fowler of Skamania County, State of Washington, claims a lien upon a quantity of saw logs branded JED, being about 250,000 feet in quantity, which logs were cut or manufactured in Skamania County, State of Washington, and were cut from Section Nine (9), Township Three (3) North, Range Nine (9) East of the Willamette Meridian, and which are now rafted in three brails and lying in Skamania County, Washington, in what is known as Drano lake, or the mouth of the Little White Salmon river; also claimant claims a lien upon one certain logging donkey engine, size 10 x 12, manufactured by Puget Sound, Iron & Steel Works, together with its blocks, lines, sled, equipment, etc., said donkey engine now being located on the northeast quarter of said section 9, township 3, north, range 9 EWM., Skamania County, Wash.

That the name of the owner or reputed owner of said logs and of said donkey engine is J. E. Rogers.

That the lien claimed is for labor performed by said claimant upon and assistance rendered in connection with the manufacture of said logs in the logging camp and in building roads and otherwise being employed in the woods by the said J. E. Rogers.

That the labor and assistance rendered by claimant has been faithfully performed and fully complied with, and that said labor and services are reasonably worth the sum of \$4.00 per day, and heard.

That the claimant began to work in the month of March, 1931, and continued to work until the 14th day of October, 1931, when his employment ceased. That he worked a total of 210 days earning the total sum of \$840.00 upon which there has been paid \$76.50 leaving a balance due of \$763.50 which is the amount claimant now demands for services rendered and upon which he claims a lien against the logs and donkey engine above described. That no part has been paid excepting the sum above specified and all of said sum of \$763.50 is now due and owing.

Notice is hereby given that George Fowler, a minor, by and through his father F. M. Fowler, claims a lien upon a quantity of saw logs branded JED, being about 350,000 feet in quantity, which logs were cut or manufactured in Skamania County, State of Washington, and were cut from Section Nine, township three, north, range nine, east of the Willamette Meridian, and which are now rafted in three brails and lying in Skamania County, Washington, in what is known as Drano Lake, or the mouth of the Little White Salmon river; also claimant claims a lien upon one certain logging donkey engine, size 10 x 12, manufactured by Puget Sound Iron & Steel Works, together with its blocks, lines, sled, equipment, etc. said donkey engine now being located on the North east quarter of said section 9, township 3, north, range 9 E. W. M. in Skamania County, Washington.

That the name of the owner or reputed owner of said logs and donkey engine is J. E. Rogers.

That the said George Fowler performed work, labor and services for the defendant above named, said George Fowler being of the age of sixteen years and being a minor and living with his father F. M. Fowler, his employment being consented to and agreed upon by F. M. Fowler and the defendant, and that said George Fowler performed a total of 182 days' services of the agreed and reasonable value of \$3.20 per day, or \$582.40. That said George Fowler should be charged with board for 222 days at \$1.10 per day, amounting to \$244.20 and three cents per day medical aid charge of \$5.46 for 182 days, and a charge at the store amounting to the sum of \$13.50, making a total deduction of \$263.16 to be credited on the above claim for labor, leaving a balance due in the sum of \$319.24.

That this claimant began work for the defendant in the month of March, 1931, and ceased work on October 19th, working a total of 182 days during said time as above set out. That the balance now due is \$319.24 which the amount claimant now demands for services rendered and upon which he claims a lien against the logs and donkey engine above described. That no part of said sum has been paid and all of said \$319.24 is now due and owing to this claimant by the defendant.
