Notice is hereby given that George Fowler, a minor, by and through his father F. M. Fowler, claims a lien upon a quantity of saw logs branded JED, being about 350,000 feet in quantity, which logs were cut or manufactured in Skamania County, State of Washington, and were cut from Section Nine, township three, north, range nine, east of the Willamette Meridian, and which are now rafted in three brails and lying in Skamania County, Washington, in what is known as Drano Lake, or the mouth of the Little White Salmon river; also claimant claims a lien upon one certain logging donkey engine, size 10 x 12, manufactured by Puget Sound Iron & Steel Works, together with its blocks, lines, sled, equipment, etc. said donkey engine now being located on the North east quarter of said section 9, township 3, north, range 9 E. W. M. in Skamania County, Washington.

That the name of the owner or reputed owner of said logs and donkey engine is J. E. Rogers.

That the said George Fowler performed work, labor and services for the defendant above named, said George Fowler being of the age of sixteen years and being a minor and living with his father F. M. Fowler, his employment being consented to and agreed upon by F. M. Fowler and the defendant, and that said George Fowler performed a total of 182 days' services of the agreed and reasonable value of \$3.20 per day, or \$582.40. That said George Fowler should be charged with board for 222 days at \$1.10 per day, amounting to \$244.20 and three cents per day medical aid charge of \$5.46 for 182 days, and a charge at the store amounting to the sum of \$13.50, making a total deduction of \$263.16 to be credited on the above claim for labor, leaving a balance due in the sum of \$319.24.

That this claimant began work for the defendant in the month of March, 1931, and ceased work on October 19th, working a total of 182 days during said time as above set out. That the balance now due is \$319.24 which the amount claimant now demands for services rendered and upon which he claims a lien against the logs and donkey engine above described. That no part of said sum has been paid and all of said \$319.24 is now due and owing to this claimant by the defendant.

Rafts Nos. 9 and 10 being two parts of logs containing 192 fir and 22 larch logs, a proximately 100,000 feet, said rafts being marked "No. 9" and "No. 10" respectively, and each of the logs therein branded and are now lying at Cooks Landing in Skamania County, Washington; also upon rafts "Nos. 3, 6, 7 and 8 marked as aforesaid, containing approximately 250,000 feet, now lying at Ryans Point in the Columbia River, near Vancouver, Clark County, Washington.

for work performed upon and assistance rendered in towing said logs and placing same in river preparatory to towing same; that the name of the owner or reputed owner is J. A. Irvin; that claimants were employed by said owner to perform said labor and render said assistance upon the following terms and condition to-wit:

For towing said logs at the rate of seventy-five cents per thousand fee, from Cooks to Vancouver, Washington; for labor on removing logs from shallow water preparatory to towing, the sum of \$70.00.

That the said work and labor has been faithfully performed by claimants who performed labor upon, and rendered such assistance between the 6th day of October 1931 and the 30th day of October, 1931, and the rendition of such services was closed on the 10th day of October, 1931, and thirty days have not elapsed since since that time; that the amount of claimants demand for said services is the sum of \$257.52, that no part thereof has been paid and there is now due and owing to the claimants after deducting all just credits and offsets the said sum of \$257.52; in which amount, they claim a lien upon said saw-logs. The said claimants now owned by said J.A. Irvin of said county to secure payment also claim a lien upon all the said saw-logs for the work and labor performed
