Beacon Rock Logging Co. to Lair and Company

Lien Notice.

Notice is hereby given that Lair & Company, a co-partnership, of Skamania County, State of Washington, claims a lien upon all logs and rafts of logs of red fir, hemlock and cedar, being about 100,000 feet in quantity, which were cut or manufactured in Skamania County, State of Washington, marked thus: 8 brand, and are now lying in or at No. 2 landing at Cascades, Washington, on the Columbia River, in Skamania County, State of Washington, for labor performed upon and assistance rendered in the building of a road over which to haul said logs; that the name of the owner or reputed owner is the Beacon Rock Logging Company; that said Beacon Rock Logging Company employed the said Lair & Company to perform such labor and render such assistance upon the following terms and conditions, to-wit:

In consideration of the building and construction of a logging road into the timber of the said Beacon Rock Logging Company by the said Lair & Company over which to haul the logs taken from the said timber, the said Beacon Rock Logging Company agreed to pay to the said Lair & Company sixty cents (60¢) per one thousand (1000) feet on all logs taken out of the timber of the said Beacon Rock Logging Company from their camp No. 2.

The said Beacon Rock Logging Company agreed to pay to said Lair & Company for such labor and assistance as above indicated; that the said contract has been faithfully performed and fully complied with on the part of the said Lair & Company, who performed labor upon and assisted in the construction of said logging road for the period of eleven months; that said labor and assistance were so performed and rendered upon said logging road between the first day of June, 1931, and the 13th day of April, 1932; and the rendition of said service was closed on the 13th day of April, 1932, and thirty days have not elapsed since said time; that the amount of claimant's demands for said service is Three Hundred Eighty-eight and 65/100 Dollars (\$388.65); that no part thereof has been paid except none, and there is now due and remaining unpaid thereon, after deducting all just credits and offsets, the sum of Three Hundred Eighty-eight and 65/100 Dollars (\$388.65), in which amount the said Lair & Company claims a lien upon said logs. The said Lair & Company also claims a lien on all said logs now owned by the said Beacon Rock Logging Company of said County to secure payment for the work and labor performed in obtaining or securing said logs, spars, piles or other timber, lumber or shingles herein described.
