BEACON ROCK LOGGING COMPANY TO LAIR & COMPANY.

LIEN NOTICE

No. 17974.

Notice is hereby given, that Lair and Company, Copartnership, of Skamania County, State of Washington, claims a lien upon all logs in pond, rafts No 9 and No 10 of logs of yellow fir, and hemlock, being about four hundred thousand feet, (400,000) in quantity, which were cut or manufactured in Skamania County, State of Washington, marked thus: C Brand, and are lying logs in pond, and raft No 10, in Butlers Slough, about 3/4 mile East of Skamania Postoffice, in Skamania County, State of Washington, and raft No 9, at Robt. McBrides landing in the Columbia River, in Clark County, State of Washington, for labor performed upon and assistance rendered in the building of a road over which to haul said logs; that the name of the reputed owner is the Beacon Rock Logging Company,; that said Beacon Rock Logging Company, employed the said Lair & Company, to perform such labor and assistance upon the following conditions, to-wit:

In consideration of the building and construction of a logging road into the timber of said Beacon Rock Logging Company said Lair and Company, over which to haul the logs taken from said timber, the said Beacon Rock Logging Company, agreed to pay the said Lair and Company. fifty cents, (.50) per thousand (1000) feet on all logs taken out of the timber of the said Beacon Rock Logging Company, from their Camp No 1.

The said, Beacon Rock Logging Company, agreed to pay to the said Lair and Company, for such labor and assistance as above indicated; that the said contract has been faithfully performed and fully complied with on the part of the said Lair and Company, who performed labor upon and assisted in the construction of the said logging road for the period of eleven months, that said labor and assistance were so performed and rendered upon said logging road, between the First day of June 1931, and the 10th day of May 1932; and rendition of said service was closed on the 10th day of May 1932, and thirty days have not elapsed since said time; that the amount of claimants demand for said services, Thirteen Hundred Fifteen and 32/100 dollars, (1315.32); that no part thereof has been paid except none, and there is now due and remaining un-paid thereon, after deducting all just credits and offsets, the sum of Thirteen Hundred Fifteen and 32/100 dollars,
