NOTICE OF LIEN CLAIM.

Claimants

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That C.T. Smith and Karl Rosenback, co-partners doing business under the firm name of Smith & Rosenback, claim a lien upon a quantity of saw-logs, being approximately 915,000 feet, which were cut and manufactured in Skamania County, Washington, and are located, marked and described as follows, to-wit;

Approximately 190,000 feet in a raft, in two sections, being raft No 8, marked with a crescent "(" and now in the Long-Pell log pond at Longview, Washington;

Approximately 350,000 feet in a raft in two sections, being raft No 9, marked with a crescent "(" and now tied in the Columbia River, in Clark County, Washington, about three miles east of the city of Vancouver in front of the McBride farm;

Approximately 225,000 feet of red fir in a raft in two sections, being raft No 10, marked "H" now tied in Butler Slough, near Skamania, Skamania County, Washington;

Approximately 150,000 feet yellow fir, partially rafted, marked with a crescent "(" now in Butler Slough, near Skamania, Skamania County, Washington.

That said lien is claimed for labor performed upon, and assistance rendered in rafting and towing said logs within the State of Washington; That the name of the owner, or reputed owner is Beacon Rock Logging Company;

That said Beacon Rock Logging Company employed said claimants to perform said labor and render such assistance upon the following terms and conditions, to-wit;

That claimants should tow all logs belonging to the said Beacon Rock Logging Company, from its booming grounds such places as should be designated by said company for the regular rates charged by claimants, and to do such other towing and booming, rafting and other services in caring for, collecting in rafts, and preparing said logs for towing as might be necessary or convenient at such regular charges as claimants usually made for such services, including towing boomsticks from place to place for use in connection with said logs.

That claimants faithfully performed said services, which consisted of towing ^{said} logs from place to place within the State of Washington, towing boom sticks, collecting and rafting logs, and other services of like nature in connection with the rafting and towing of said logs; that the reasonable value of said services, was the sum of \$755.78, and the said Beacon Rock Logging Company promised and agreed to pay claimants for said services the sum of \$755.78

That the labor rendered and assistance given in rafting and towing said logs, and caring for the same as aforesaid, for which this claim is made, commenced on the 15th day of October 1931, and closed on the 24th day of May 1932, and thirty days have not elapsed since the date and rendition of said services was closed.

That the amount of claimants' said claim is the sum of \$755.78 and no part thereof has been paid; that there is now due and owing to the claimants, and unpaid upon said claim, over and above all just credits and offsets the sum of \$755.78 in which amount they claim a lien upon said saw-logs.

That the said claimants also claim a lien on all said saw-logs now owned by said
