

"Aleck" Claim. Copper Creek Mining District.

Notice of Location of Luray Claim.

Notice is hereby given that the undersigned, a citizen of the United States, over the age of twenty-one years, on the 10 day of Sept 1899, discovered a vein or lode of Luray or sand rock in place bearing Gold, Silver and Lead, within the limits of the claim hereby located, and have this 15 day of Sept 1899, under and in accordance with the Revised Statutes of the United States, located fifteen hundred linear feet of this vein or lode in length, with surface ground, three hundred feet in width on each side of the center of said lode, situated in the Copper Creek mining District, County of Skamania and State of Washington and known as the Aleck mining Claim, and extending fifteen hundred feet to and from this notice at the discovery of prospect shaft; the exterior boundaries of this claim being distinctly marked by reference to natural objects or permanent monuments, and more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at shaft & Notice & running 300 ft. S.E. to S.E. corner. Thence 1,000 ft. North of N.E. to N.E. corner. Thence 600 ft. N.W. to N.W. corner. Thence 1,500 ft. South of S.W. to S.W. corner. Thence 300 ft. S.E. to shaft & Notice.

Said claim is situated on the East side of Texas gulch at an old abandoned shaft & is about 1 1/4 mile West of Lookout Mountain on the opposite side of Texas gulch where the trail enters the gulch & is in Sec 25 Township 4 North of range 5 East & joins the Texas on the East side & the Amuck on the North East end and that I intend to hold and work said above described claim as provided by the local laws, and the customs and rules of miners, and mining statutes and laws of the United States.
