NOTICE OF CLAIM OF LIEN

Notice is hereby given that John Rakoz and Steven Rakoz, partners, of Skamania County, State of Washington, claim a lien upon two brails of cedar and fir logs, being about 150,000 feet board measure in quantity, which were cut or manufactured in Skamania County, Washington, upon the Northeast quarter of section 22, in township 4 north of range 9 east of the Willamette Meridian, on land known as the "Fisher Claim" all of which logs are mared TD and BHF, and now are lying in the Columbia River at Cook, Skamania County, Washington, and in the pond adjacent thereof, which claim is for labor performed upon and assistance rendered in obtaining, securing, transporting and hauling said logs from the place where cut to Cook, Skamania County, Washington, and for furnishing and hauling from the mill at Willard, Skamania County, Washington, 1200 feet of bridge planks, also for hauling from Castle Rock Washington, ^{to} the place where said logs were cut, one donkey sled and one loading donkey engine, and for two hours labor with a truck in hauling water from creek nearby said camp to the logging camp operated by defendants, and in transporting 5800 feet of logs to mills at or near Willard, Washington.

That the name of the owner or reputed owner of said logs is Fred Lawless; and that defendant, Arthur Lawless, has or claims to have some right, title, lien or interest in and to said logs; and that the said Fred Lawless employed the said claimants, John Rakoz and Steven Rakoz, to perform such labor and render such assistance, upon the following terms and conditions, to-wit:

The said Fred Lawless promised and agreed to pay to the said claimants herein for such labor and assistance in transporting 259,599 feet of logs from the place where cut to Cook, Washington, at the rate of \$1.75 per thousand or the sum of \$453.93

In hauling and transporting from the place where cut to the said Cook, Washington, 244,828 feet of logs at the rate of \$2.00 per thousand, or the sum of 469.65

In transporting from the place where cut to mills at or near Willard, Washington 5800 feet of logs at the rate of \$1.50 per thousand 8.70

For hauling and transporting said donkey sled from Castle Rock, in Cowlitz County, Washington, to the place where said logs were cut, 15.00

For hauling and transporting said loading donkey engine from Castle Rock, in Cowlitz County, Washington, to the place where said logs were cut, the sum of 35.00

Carried forward, \$1002.28

Brought forward \$1002.28

For hauling water from a creek near where said logs were cut to the logging camp, 3.00

For furnishing and hauling from Willard, Washington, to the said logging camp and place where said logs were cut, 1200 feet of bridge planks 16.00

or a total sum of \$1021.28

That said contract has been faithfully performed and fully complied with on the part of John Rakoz and Steven Rakoz, partners, claimants herein, in hauling and delivering said logs from the said place where cut to Cook, Washington, in hauling and transporting said donkey sled from Castle Rock, Washington, to the logging camp of the defendants herein, in hauling and transporting said loading donkey engine from Castle Rock, Washington, to the logging camp of the defendants herein, in hauling said water and in furnishing and hauling said 1200 feet of bridge planks from Willard, Washington, to the logging camp of the defendants herein, and in transporting 5800 feet of logs to mills at or near Willard, Washington.

That claimants commenced work for defendants on the 22nd day of July, 1932; and that claimants ceased to perform said work and labor for defendants on the 14th day of October, 1932, and that all of said labor and assistance was so performed and rendered upon said logs, and in hauling and transporting said logs, and in hauling and transporting said donkey sled and loading donkey engine, and in hauling said water, and in furnishing and hauling said bridge planks, between said 22nd day of July, 1932 and the 14th day of October, 1932, both days inclusive; and that the rendition of said services closed on the said 14th day of October, 1932; and that thirty days has not elapsed since the date of ceasing to furnish said services as above described.

That claimants have demanded from the defendants payment for said services; and that the defendants have failed, refused and neglected to pay the claimants the said sum of \$1021.28, or any part thereof, except the sum of \$644.98 paid as follows:

\$600.74 in cash and
\$44.24 paid by furnishing claimants gas in that amount; and that there is now due and owing from the defendants to claimants for the said labor performed and materials furnished the full sum of \$376.30, and for which said sum the said claimants, John Rakoz and Steven Rakoz, as partners, claim a lien upon the logs hereinabove described and located in two tracts in the Columbia River at Cook, Skamania County, State of Washington, and in the pond adjacent thereto, to secure payment for obtaining, transporting, hauling and transferring said logs from the place where cut to the Columbia River in Cook, in Skamania County, State of Washington, and in transporting and hauling said donkey sled and loading donkey engine, hauling water and furnishing and hauling said bridge planks as hereinabove described, and in transporting 5800 feet of logs to mills at or near Willard, Washington.
