

Notice of Location of Norway Lode E.

Norway Lode, New Extension, Claim No. 1.2nd discovery
 Notice is hereby given that the undersigned having
 complied with the requirements of Chapter 103 of
 Title Thirty-two of the Revised Statutes of the United
 States and the local customs, laws and regulations
 has located 1500 x 600 linear feet on the Norway
 lode, situated in St. Helens Mining District, State
 of Washington and described as follows:

Beginning at the second discovery situ-
 ated about 150 feet N. 15° W. of discovery on first
 and original claim on the Norway Lode discovery
 and located by W. W. Conner in the year 1895 and
 now of record with the Auditor of Manama Co. Wash.
 said New Extension Claim commences at the second
 discovery about 25 feet S.W. from notice placed on a
 large Larch tree and running thence N 15° W. May
 1500 x 600 linear feet to the N.W. End post a Hemlock
 tree about 12 inches diameter and blazed on four sides
 Boundaries are as follows: S.W. corner a small Larch
 or Balsam Fir tree about 8 inches diameter S.E. corner -
 a yellow Cedar tree about 12 inches diameter N.E. corner
 a Larch or Balsam Fir tree about 15 inches diam
 N.W. corner a Hemlock tree about 18 inches diam.
 all of which four trees representing the four corners of
 the claim are faced on four sides and properly
 marked. The above claim was formerly located
 by one H. Lindloff in the year 1895 but neither the
 required annual assessment work nor work of any
 kind having been performed nor any ore having pre-
 viously been discovered, on this claim the same
 was open for location. Including all dips, spurs
 and creeks angles and parallels and all other essentials
 and variations.
