

"Copley" Claim. St. Helens Mining District.

Notice of Location.

Notice is hereby given that the undersigned in compliance with the requirements of the Revised Statutes of the United States have this day located and claim 1500 linear feet along the course of this lead lode or vein of mineral bearing quartz and 300 feet in width on each side of the middle of said vein together with and mineral deposits contained therein; all timber growing within the limits of said claim and all water privileges thereon or appurtenant. Whereby situated in the St. Helens Mining District Okanogan County State of Washington and more particularly described as follows:

beginning at discovery near a small cascade on the North Fork of the Cowlitz River about  $\frac{3}{4}$  of a mile from its termination or beginning said cascade being part of a large cascade or fall at the top of which is the Esther Mary mine claim location and about 300 feet below the Christopher mining cabin and about  $\frac{1}{2}$  a mile below the Juniper mine claim and about  $\frac{1}{4}$  of a mile above the separation of the Spirit Lake and Lewis River trails. And extends 1500 feet in a South Easterly direction about  $18^{\circ}$  E of S. and 300 feet in width on each side of the centre of said vein and is a relocation of the Copley mine claim located July 13 1894. It adjoins the Octavia mine claim & relocation of the Little Octavia mine claim said claim having boundaries marked by substantial posts as required by law and also a line placed about its boundaries on all intersecting trees. Said claim was relocated September 16 1899 & was discovered at this point in the creek by digging in September 1895 a. d. discovery is about 50 feet south of the Little Octavia discovery and is situated in Okanogan County, State of Washington and shall be known as the Copley mine claim.
