WITNESSETH: THAT the said party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of Five Dollars, to him in hand paid by the said party of the second part, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, hath granted bargained, sold remised, released unto the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns, the undivided one third interest in the Silver Queen Lode as located, Surveyed, Recorded and held by the said party of the first part, situated in Texas Mining District, Skamania County, State of Washington, together with all the metals, ores, gold and silver bearing quartz rock and earth therein, and all the rights privileges thereto incident or in anywise appertaining: To have and to hold the said premises, together with the appurtenances thereto belonging, to the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns forever.

Gray, of the City of Vancouver, State of Washington the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted, bargained, and sold and we do by these presents grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Charles L. Gray. and unto his heirs and assigns the following described premises, namely.

The undivided one third (1/3) of the following described land to wit: - The East half of Section twenty-six (26); the Northwest quarter of section twenty-six (26), both in Township three (3) North of Range six (6) East of the Willamette Meridian; - Lots (3) three and four (4), and South half of North West quarter of section four (4); East half of Section eighteen (18) and North East Quarter; East half of North West quarter, and half of South West quarter of Section Twelve (12) in Township two (2) North of Range Six (6) East of the Willamette Meridian, all in Skamania County State of Washington, and containing in the aggregate, 1283 acre. Together with all and singular the tenements, hereditaments
