NOTICE OF LIEN

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That L. W. Caswell, of 7714 S.E. 17th Avenue, Portland, Oregon, claims a lien upon eight (8) rafts of saw logs and two (2) rafts of piling, there being about five thousand (5,000) lineal feet in each raft of piling and fifty thousand (50,000) feet in each raft of saw logs, totaling four hundred thousand (400,000) feet of saw logs and ten thousand (10,000) lineal feet of piling which were cut from Sections fourteen (14), fifteen (15) and twenty-two (22), Township three (3) North, Range eight (8) East of the Willamette Meridian, Skamania County, Washington, part of which saw logs and piling are marked thus: W; part of which saw logs and piling are marked L, and part of which saw logs and piling are marked O. Two (2) rafts of said saw logs and one raft of piling which are now lying in a boom at the mouth of Wind River, Skamania County, Washington, and six (6) rafts of saw logs and one of piling now lying in the boom at Home Valley in the Columbia River.

Said Claim is for labor performed by the Claimant in hauling said saw logs and piling on the Claimant's trucks from the logging operations where the same were cut to the booms on the rivers above mentioned; that the name of the owner or reputed owner

is Frank Birkenfield; that he employed the said L. W. Caswell under the terms of a written Contract, a copy of which, marked "Exhibit A" is attached hereto and by reference made a part hereof, which said Contract was subsequently modified to the extent that the Claimant was to receive One and 50/100 (\$1.50) Dollars a thousand feet for hauling the saw logs and one-and-one-half (1½) cents per lineal foot for hauling the piling; that in accordance with said agreement as modified, the said L.W.Caswell hauled 21,355 lineal feet of piling and 264,153 feet of saw logs and that the amount of his claim thereon for hauling is Seven hundred Twenty-Five and 54/100 (\$725.54) Dollars; that the Claimant performed such services in the hauling of such piling and saw logs between the 2nd day of May, 1933, and the 24th day of July, 1933, and that such services were closed on the 24th day of July, 1933; that more than thirty (30) days have not elapsed since that time; that the amount of Claimant's demand is Seven hundred Twenty Five and 54/100 (\$725.54) Dollars; that no part thereof has been paid excepting the sum of Fifty-Five and 18/100 (\$55.18) Dollars, and there is now due and remaining unpaid thereon, after deducting all just credits and offsets, the sum of Six Hundred Seventy and 36/100 (\$670.36) Dollars, in which amount he claims a lien upon all the said above described saw logs and piling, to secure the payment for the work and labor performed in hauling the said saw logs and piling as herein set out.

#### EXHIBIT A

THIS AGREEMENT Made and entered into this 2nd day of May, 1933 by and between Frank Birkenfield party of the first part and L. W. Caswell, party of the second part, witnesseth:

That the parties of the second part promise and agree to haul logs for the party of the first part from his logging operations in sections 14, 15, and 22 tp 3 N R 8 E. W.M., for the following prices to-wit:

For saw-logs the sum of \$1.00 per thousand feet

For piling the sum of one cent (1¢) per running foot;

Provided, that the above prices are based upon a price of \$7.00 for logs F O B Portland, Oregon, and a price of six cents per foot for piling F O B Portland; should the price of logs exceed said price then in such event the parties of the second part shall receive 25 cents additional for each \$1.00 increase in price until a maximum of \$2.00 per thousand feet for hauling is reached, and the party of the first part reserves the right to cease logging operations in case the price of logs falls below \$7.00 per thousand feet and piling to less than six cents per lineal foot.

The said timber shall be loaded by the party of the second part but the equipment or loading shall be furnished by the party of the first part. The party of the first
