

"Gold Ring" Mining claim on Mc-Kiloskey Creek.

Notice of Location of Quartz claim.

Notice is hereby given that the undersigned, a citizen of the United States, over the age of twenty-one years, on the 1 day of January, 1900, discovered a vein or lode of Quartz or other hard rock in place bearing Gold, Silver and Lead, within the limits of the claim hereby located, and have this first day of January, 1900, under and in accordance with the Revised Statutes of the United States, located fifteen hundred linear feet of this vein or lode in length, with surface ground, three hundred feet in width on each side of the center of said lode, situated in the North East quarter Sec 26 Town 2 North Range 5 East, Mining District County of Skamania, and state of Washington, designated and known as the Gold Ring Mining claim, and extending fifteen hundred feet to and from this notice at the discovery or prospect shaft; the exterior boundaries of this claim being distinctly marked by reference to natural objects or permanent monuments, and more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at the notice 152 feet northerly from shaft running 300 feet easterly thence 1500 feet southerly, thence 600 feet westerly, thence 1500 feet northerly, thence 300 feet to notice or beginning.

Prospect notice marked with stone monument north west corner cedar post north east corner cedar post, south east corner cedar post, south west corner a fir tree eight inches in diameter cut off four feet high line's Blazed, and that we intend to hold and work said above described claim as provided by the local laws, and the customs and rules of miners, and mining statutes and laws of the United States.
