

"Lucky Boy" : Copper Creek Mining District.

Notice of Location.

Quartz Lode Mining Claim.

The Undersigned, who is a citizen of the United States, hereby declare and give notice to all persons concerned, that he has discovered a vein or lode within the limits of the claim hereby located, and in said lode a vein or crevice of quartz or ore, with at least one well-defined wall, and that he has this 1st day of January A. D. 1900, located and do hereby locate and claim, under and by virtue of Chapter six, Title thirty-two, of the Revised Statutes of the United States, and the laws amendatory thereto, and the laws of the State of Washington, a mining claim upon said Lode or Vein, to be designated and named the Lucky Boy Quartz Lode Mining Claim, extending along said Lode or Vein 1500 feet in a S. W. direction and 300 feet in a S. E. N. W. direction from the center of the discovery shaft (at which shaft this notice and statement is posted) and 300 feet on each side from the middle or center of said Lode or Vein at the surface; comprising in all 1500 feet in length along said Lode or Vein, and 600 feet in width, with all the rights and privileges, as to surface ground and lodes, vein or ledges, within the boundaries of said claim and otherwise, and the metals, minerals and valuable deposits of every kind contained in said veins, lodes or ledges, or within said boundaries, which are given or allowed by the laws of the United States aforesaid, or of the State of Washington.
