

THE UNITED STATES TO LEVY LEON.

THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA:

Certificate No. 3376.

To all to whom these Presents shall Come, Greeting.

Whereas, Levy Leon, of Multnomah County, Oregon has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Vancouver, Washington Territory, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Levy Leon, according to the provisions of the "Act of Congress of the 24th^{day} of April, 1820, entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands", and the acts supplemental thereto, for the North West quarter of Section Twenty-eight in township three North of Range six East of Willamette Meridian in Washington, Territory, containing one hundred and sixty acres, according to the official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Levy Leon.

Now Know Ye, That the United States of America, in consideration of the premises and in conformity with the several Acts of Congress in such case made and provided have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Levy Leon, and to his heirs heirs, the said Tract above described. To have and to hold the same together with all the rights privileges, immunities and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging unto the, said Levy Leon, and to his heirs and assigns forever: Subject to any vested and accrued water rights for, mining agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged, by local customs, laws, and decisions of Courts, and also subject to the right of the proprietor of a vein or lode to extract and remove his ore therefrom should the same be found to penetrate or intersect the premises hereby granted, as provided by law.

In testimony Whereof, I, Benjamin Harrison, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.



To have and to hold the same to the said Washougal Land and Logging Company, their heirs and assigns forever. And August Lucke and ~~the~~ Wilhelmine Lucke his wife does covenant with the said Washougal Land and Logging Company, their heirs, assigns and their legal representative forever that the said real estate is free from incumbrances and that they are the owners in fee simple and have a good right to sell and convey the same and that they will and their heirs, Executors and Administrators shall warrant and defend the same to the said Washougal Land and Logging Company, their heirs and assigns forever against the law full claims and demands of all persons whomsoever.
