

"Silence" claim. Bald Mountain Mining District.

Notice of Location.

Notice is hereby given that I, Jonathan Bourne, a citizen of the United States, have discovered a lode of rock in place, carrying gold, silver, copper and other valuable deposits, upon which, at the point of discovery, I have posted this notice.

In accordance with the laws of the United States and of the State of Washington, I hereby claim fifteen hundred linear feet of said vein and lode, measured thereon as hereinafter set forth. The general course of this lode is South Westerly. I claim in length thereon, 1500 feet from the point of discovery at which this notice is posted. I also claim 300 feet on each side of the center of said lode.

Said lode is situated in the Bald Mountain Mining District in the County of Shastana, State of Washington. It shall be known as the Silence lode, and this claim shall be known as the Silence lode claim. Said discovery was made Jan. 26. 1900.

In accordance with the laws of the State of Washington, I claim thirty days from date of such discovery to enable me to mark the surface boundaries of the claim, and to otherwise perfect and record the location of said claim.
