

U.S. to E.C.HARDY AND WIFE.

THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA:

To all to whom these presents shall come Greeting:.

Whereas, There has been deposited in the General Land office of the United States a Certificate numbered one hundred and twelve of the Register and Receiver at Vancouver, Washington Territory whereby it appears that under the provisions of the Act of Congress approved the 27th day of September, 1850 entitled an act to create the <sup>office</sup> of Surveyor General of the Public Lands in Oregon and to provide for the survey and to make donation to the settler of the said Public Lands, and the legislation supplemental thereto, the claim of Ebenezer C. Hardy and his wife Mary H. Hardy of Skamania County, Washington Territory Notification No. 842, <sup>has</sup> ~~have~~ been established to a donation of one half section or three hundred and twenty acres <sup>of land</sup> and that the same has been surveyed and designated as claim number thirty eight being part of section twenty-five in Township <sup>being part</sup> ~~in~~ two north of Range, six East and claim number forty one ~~part~~ of section thirty on Township two North of Range seven East according to the official Plat of Survey returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, being bounded and described as follows to-wit: Beginning at a point one chain and twenty seven links west of the North west corner of section thirty in township two north of Range seven East, and running thence south fifty seven chains and forty links <sup>thence</sup> south eighty six <sup>degrees</sup> and forty five minutes East ~~and~~ two chain, thence North eighty six degrees and thirty minutes, East seven chains and fifty links; thence south seventy four degrees East six Chains, thence North sixty two degrees and forty-five minutes East fourteen chains and fifty links; thence North forty eight <sup>East ten chains thence North sixty</sup> degrees and fifteen minutes East five chains; thence north seventy five degrees and forty five minutes East two chains and seventy five links; thence North seventy degrees and thirty minutes East eleven chains and fifty links; thence North sixty-one degrees and forty five minutes East five chains and fifty links <sup>north thirty</sup> thence five degrees East two chains thence north <sup>forty</sup> six degrees East three chains and ninety links; thence north forty one degrees East eight chains. thence north fifty degrees and fifteen minutes East five chain; thence north thirtysix degrees and fifteen minutes East two chains and twentyfive links; thence North fifty nine degrees East four chains and sixty-six links; thence north one chain and ninety-five links; thence north sixty degrees and thirty ~~three~~ minutes East five chains and eight links; thence north twenty two degrees west eleven chains and forty links; and thence west seventy seven chains to the place of beginning in the District of <sup>land</sup> ~~law~~ subject to sale at Vancouver Washington Territory containing three hundred and nineteen acres, and eight hundredths of an acre. Now Know ye that the United States of America in consideration of the premises and in conformity with the provisions of the Act aforesaid have Given and Granted and by these presents Do Give and Grant unto the said Ebenezer C. Hardy and <sup>to</sup> His heirs the East half, and to his wife the said Mary H. Hardy and to her heirs the west half of the tract of land above described To have and to hold the said Tract ~~xx~~ with the appurtenances, unto the said Ebenezer C. Hardy and his wife Mary H. Hardy and to their heirs and assigns forever their respective <sup>portion</sup> ~~positions~~ as aforesaid, I in testimony whereof I Andrew Johnson President of the United States have caused these letters to be made Patent and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed, Given under my hand ~~xxx~~ at the City of Washington, This twenty second day of December in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty six, and of the Independence of the United States the ninetieth.
