

"Boss Mackin" claim. Bald Mountain Mining District.

Certificate of Location of Quartz Mining Claim.

I, Jonathan Bourne Jr., a citizen of the United States, hereby certify that on the day of March 16<sup>th</sup> 1900, I discovered within the limits of the claim hereinafter described a lode of rock in place bearing gold, silver, copper and other valuable minerals; that thereafter, and prior to recording this certificate, I located said claim in the following manner: On the 16th day of March 1900 I posted at the point of discovery a plain notice, of which the following is a copy, to wit:

Notice of Location.

Notice is hereby given that I, Jonathan Bourne Jr., a citizen of the United States, have discovered a lode of rock in place carrying gold, silver, copper and other valuable deposits upon which, at the point of discovery, I have posted this notice.

In accordance with the laws of the United States and of the State of Washington, I hereby claim fifteen hundred linear feet of said vein and lode, measured thereon as hereinafter set forth. The general course of this lode is North 65°59' West. A claim in length thereon fifteen hundred feet N. 65°59' W. from the point of discovery at which this notice is posted. I also claim Sixty (60) feet on each side of the center of said lode.

Said lode is situated in the Bald Mountain mining district in the County of Skamania, State of Washington. It shall be known as the North Boss lode, and this claim shall be known as the Boss Fraction lode claim. Said discovery was made March 16 1900.

In accordance with the laws of the State of Washington, I claim ninety days from date of such discovery to enable me to definitely mark the surface boundaries of the claim, and to otherwise perfect and record the location of said claim.

(On the - day of March 20 1900, I marked the surface

boundaries of said claim by placing substantial posts bearing the name of the lode and of the claim, and date of location, at each corner of said claim, said posts being not less than three feet high, and four inches in diameter and cut the brush and marked and blazed the trees along the lines of said claim to indicate the location of such lines.

The general course of said lode is North  $65^{\circ}59'$  West, I claim fifteen hundred linear feet on said lode, to wit: fifteen hundred feet in length North  $65^{\circ}59'$  West from point of discovery, and in width Sixty (60) feet on each side of the center of said lode, and all mineral deposits contained within the surface boundaries of said claim as hereinafter described.

Said claim is and shall be known as the Boss Fraction lode claim. Said claim is situated in the Bald Mountain Mining District, in the County of Okanogan, State of Washington, and as marked on the ground the surface boundary of said claim is particularly described as follows, to wit:

Beginning at a post in a mound of stone, at the South east corner of said claim; the same being also the northeast corner of the Boss Mining Claim:

Said post being Three thousand, three hundred and thirty two (3332) feet South and Three thousand, two hundred, seventy three and one half ( $3273\frac{1}{2}$ ) feet East of the Northwest corner of Section Twenty Eight in Township & Range five East of the Willamette Meridian: Thence North  $65^{\circ}59'$  West, fifteen hundred (1500) feet: thence North  $17^{\circ}35'$  East, one hundred and twenty (120) feet: thence South  $65^{\circ}59'$  East, fifteen hundred (1500) feet: thence South  $17^{\circ}35'$  West, one hundred and twenty (120) feet to the place of beginning.

I'd intended to hold and work said above-described claim as provided by the laws of the United States and of the State of Washington.
