

Notice of Mill Site.

To Whom it may concern:

Know ye that I, Henry H. Coe, of Kamronia County, Washington, Do hereby declare to you, the Chicago North West Discovery claim #1 Mill Site, Beginning at a White Fir tree blazed on 4 sides situate 200 feet North Westerly from the discovery point of the May Queen Mining Lode and on the North West side line of such lode as post #1 or south West corner of this Mill Site claim and running North Easterly 800 feet to a Hornlock tree blazed on two sides, the North East corner post or post #2 from thence North Westerly 200 feet to a Hornlock tree blazed on 4 sides at the North West corner post or post #3 said post having the location notices for this claim, thence South Westerly 800 feet to a White Fir tree blazed on 4 sides being the South West corner post or post #4 and from thence South Easterly to point of beginning. This claim adjoins the May Queen Mill Site claim on the South East for its full length and its South West end is against the North East side line of the May Queen Mining claim, It is about 1400 feet Northerly from the Broadwell cabin and about 3/4 mile North East of the Lacombe cabin and about 1 mile West of Mt. Bismark and is crossed by the North Fork of the Snake River.
