THE U.S. to ALBERT G. TUCKER

Certificate No. 1907.

THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, To all to whom these presents Shall Come Greeting: Whereas Albert G. Tucker, of Skamania County, Washington Territory, has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Vancouver, Washington, Territory, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said A. G. Tucker, according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An Act making further provisions for the sale of the Public Lands," and the acts supplemental thereto for the South East quarter of the North East quarter and the North East quarter of the South East quarter, of Section Twenty, in Township Three North of Range Eight East of Willamette Meridian in Washington Territory, Containing eighty acres, according to the official Plat of the Survey of said Lands returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Albert G. Tucker.

Now Know Ye, That the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several Acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Albert G. Tucker, and to his heirs, the said Tract above described: To have and to hold the same together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said Albert G. Tucker and to his heirs and assigns forever; subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged by the Local customs, laws, and decisions of Courts, and also subject to the right of the proprietor of a vein or lode, to extract and remove his ore therefrom, should the same be found to penetrate or intersect the premises hereby granted as provided by law.

In testimony whereof, I, Chester A. Arthur, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
