# NOTICE OF CLAIM OF LIEN

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Joseph R. Orteig, of Clark County, in the State of Washington claims a lien upon 960 fir railroad ties in the possession of V. M. Dobbins, and under the control of the said V. M. Dobbins, the manufacturer of said ties, and which said ties were sawed and manufactured from saw logs for use as railroad ties by the said V. M. Dobbins in Skamania County, in the State of Washington, from faw logs that were grown and cut in Skamania County, Washington, and all of which said 960 railroad ties are now situated and located at North Bonneville, in Skamania County, Washington, on the right of way of the Spokane, Portland and Seattle Railway Company, which said claim is for labor performed upon, and assistance rendered in sawing and manufacturing said ties out of saw logs, and timber into said railroad ties in Skamania County in the State of Washington.

That the name of the owner or reputed owner, of said railroad ties is V. M. Dobbins, and the said V.M. Dobbins employed the said Joseph R. Orteig to perform said labor and assistance in sawing said railroad ties and in manufacturing said ties, upon the following terms and conditions, to-wit:

That the said V.M. Dobbins promised and agreed to pay the said Joseph R. Orteig the sum of \$2.00 per day for each and every day or part thereof, and that he rendered said labor and services in the sawing and manufacturing of said railroad ties.

That the said contract has been faithfully performed and complied with on the part of the said Joseph R. Orteig, who performed the labor and rendered the assistance in the sawing and manufacturing of said fir logs into said railroad ties, in all sixty-four and one-half days, for which he was to receive the sum of \$2.00 per day, for each day or part thereof, and that said work, labor, and assistance performed by the said Joseph R. Orteig, for the said V.M. Dobbins as above set forth, were then reasonably worthy of the sum of \$2.00 per day for each day, as commenced on or about the 10 day of April, 1935 and terminated on the 9 day of August, 1935, the first and last day herein mentioned both inclusive, in all sixty-four and one-

that said labor and assistance was so performed and rendered upon said timber, in operating said saw mill in the sawing and manufacturing of said timber into said rail road ties.

And that the rendition of said service was closed on the 9 day of August, 1935, and that 30 days has not elapsed since that time.

That the amount of claimant's demand was \$129.00 and that a part thereof has been paid excepting \$74.85, and it is now due and owing, after deducting the just debts and offsets, the sum of \$52.69, for which amount the said Joseph R. Orteig claims a lien upon said rail road ties, to secure the payment for said labor and assistance in sawing and manufacturing said timber into said rail road ties herein described.
