Homestead Certificate, No. 1608, Application No. 2790.

The United States of America, To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:  
Whereas, There has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Vancouver, Washington Territory, whereby it appears that pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th May, 1862, "To secure Homesteads to actual settlers on the Public Domain," And the Acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Albert G. Tucker has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the North East quarter of the North East quarter of Section Twenty, in Township, three North of Range eight East of Willamette Meridian, in Washington Territory, containing, Forty acres, according to the official Plat of the Survey of the said lands, returned to the General Land Office, by the Surveyor General:

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said. Albert G. Tucker, the Tract of land above described:

To have and to Hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Albert G. Tucker, and to his heirs and assigns forever, subject to any vested and accrued water rights, for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights of ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water, rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, laws, and decisions of courts, and also subject to the right of the proprietor of a vein or lode to extract and remove his ore therefrom should the same be found to penetrate or intersect the premises hereby granted as provided by law.

In Testimony Whereof, I, Benjamin Harrison, President of the United States, of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Whereas, Justin Chenoweth, of Clarke County Washington Territory, has deposited in the general Land Office of the United States, a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Vancouver, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Justin Chenoweth, according to the provisions of the Acts of Congress of 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public lands", for the lot numbered Five in the North West quarter of Section eleven in Township two, North of Range Seven East, in the District of lands subject to sale at Vancouver, Washington territory, containing Forty-three acres, according to the official Plat of the survey of the said lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said Tract has been purchased by the said Justin Chenoweth.
