NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that James Snyder of Clark County in the State of Washington claims a lien upon 960 fir railroad ties in the possession of V. M. Dobbins and under the control of V. M. Dobbins, and marked "D", the manufacturer of said ties and which said ties were sawed and manufactured from saw logs for use as railroad ties by the said V. M. Dobbins, in Skamania County, in the State of Washington, from fir saw logs that were grown and cut in Skamania County, Washington, and all of which said 960 railroad ties are now situated and located on the right of way of the Spokane Portland, and Seattle, Railway company at Bonneville, in Skamania County, Washington which said claim is for labor performed upon and assistance rendered in sawing and manufacturing said ties out of saw logs and timber into said railroad ties in Skamania County, in the state of Washington.

That the name of the owner, or reputed owner, of said railroad ties is V.M. Dobbins;

and the said V. M. Dobbins employed the said James Snyder to perform said labor and assistance in sawing said railroad ties and in manufacturing said ties in a saw mill in Skamania County, Washington upon the following terms and conditions, to-wit:

That the said V.M. Dobbins promised and agreed to pay the said said James Snyder the sum of \$2.00 per day for each and every day or part thereof, that he rendered said labor and services in the sawing and manufacturing of said railroad ties.

That the said contract has been fully conformed and complied with on the part of the said James Snyder, who performed the labor and rendered the assistance in the sawing and manufacturing of said fir logs into said railroad ties, in all forty-nine days, for which the said V.M. Dobbins promised and agreed to pay James Snyder the sum of \$2.00 per day for each day or part thereof that he rendered said work labor and assistance by the said James Snyder for the said V.M. Dobbins as above set forth, and that said labor and assistance were then reasonably worth and of the value of the sum of \$2.00 per day for each day or part thereof.

That said James Snyder commenced said labor and rendered such said assistance on or about the 17th day of May, 1935, and terminated said labor and assistance on the 13th day of August, 1935, the first and last day herein mentioned, both inclusive, in all forty-nine days.

That the amount of claimants demand was for said labor and assistance, the sum of \$98.00 and that no part thereof has been paid excepting \$50.00, and that it is now due and owing to James Snyder, after deducting the just debts and offsets, the sum of \$48.00 for which amount the said James Snyder claims a lien upon all said railroad ties to secure the payment for said labor and assistance in sawing and manufacturing said timber into said railroad ties herein before described.
