

Water Right on Canyon Creek, Copper Creek Mining District.
Notice of Water Right.

State of Washington, I.,
County of Skamania, I.,

The undersigned, citizens of the United States, hereby give Notice as follows, to-wit:

First: That they claim (and appropriate) the water lying, being and flowing in Canyon Creek and its tributaries emptying therein above this point to the extent of 15,000 cubic feet per second of time.

Second: That said water is appropriated for mining, manufacturing, milling, power and domestic purposes, and the place of its intended use is at either or all of the following named mining claims and mill sites, to-wit: The Baker Boy ground claim and the Good Hope quartz mining claim, and the Baker Boy mill site, all being situated and located in the Copper Creek Mining District, in the County of Skamania, State of Washington, and other mining claims and mill sites now owned or hereafter located or acquired by him in said District.

Third: The means by which it is intended to divert said water from the natural channel of said Canyon Creek is by ditch, ditches, flume, flumes, flumes or pipes, or by ditches, flumes and pipes) beginning at a point where this notice is posted, on the East bank or side of said Canyon Creek about two and one half ($\frac{1}{2}$) miles Southeast of Copper City, said water to be conveyed in the manner aforesaid from said point where this notice is posted on the nearest and most practicable way or route or ways and routes to said intended place and places of use.
