NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Cecil C. Powers of Skamania County, State of Washington, claims a lien upon a quantity of fir, sawed railroad ties being about 109000 feet, board measure, in quantity, each tie being 7 X 9 inches square and 8 feet long the total number of ties being about 2400 in number, unbranded, being sawed timber, which were cut or manufactured in Skamania County, State of Washington, are unmarked except as above described, and are now lying in what is known as Greenleaf Slough in sections 16, 20 and 21 Township 2 North of Range 7 East of the Willamette Meridian about one mile in a north-westerly direction from the water tank and station on the Spokane, Portland & Seattle Railway known as Cascade Station in said Skamania County, State of Washington, for labor and assistance rendered in and about cutting, sawing, manufacturing fluming and securing and preparing said railroad ties for market; that the name of the owner, or reputed owner, of said railroad ties is W.A. Kemp, R.O.Tompkins and E.O.Samuels doing business as a partnership under the firm name and style of Kemp, Tompkins & Samuels; that said Kemp, Tompkins & Samuels employed said Cecil C. Powers to perform such labor and render such assistance upon the following terms and conditions, to wit:

The said Kemp, Tompkins & Reynolds agreed to pay the said Cecil C.Powers the sum of \$2.00 from June 8, 1914, to July 15, 1914, inclusive; from July 15, 1914, to August 15, 1914, inclusive the sum of \$2.25 per day and from August 16 to September 2nd, 1914, inclusive, the sum of \$2.50 per day, and claimant was to pay said Kemp, Tompkins & Samuels the sum of 25 cents per meal for board and \$1.00 per month hospital dues; that said contract has been faithfully performed and fully complied with on the part of said Cecil C.Powers, who performed labor upon and assisted in and about cutting, sawing, manufacturing, fluming preparing and securing said railroad ties for market for the period of 73½ days; that

said labor and services were so performed and rendered upon said railroad ties between the 7th day of June, 1914, and the 3d day of September, 1914, and the rendition of said service was closed on the 2nd day of September, 1914, and thirty days have not elapsed since that time; that the amount of claimant's demand for said service is \$160.10; that no part thereof has been paid except the sum of \$59.25 and there is now due and remaining unpaid thereon, after deducting all just credits and offsets, the sum of \$100.85 in which amount he claims a lien upon said fir railroad ties. The said Cecil C. Powers also claims a lien on all said railroad ties now owned by said Kemp, Tompkins & Samuels of said county to secure payment for the work and labor performed in obtaining or securing said timber products herein described.
