Whereas, there has been deposited in the General Land Office at Vancouver, Washington Territory, whereby it appears that prusuant to "Act of Congress approved 20th May, 1862, "To secure Homesteads to actual settlers on the Public Domain", and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Caleb J. Moore has been established and duly consumated in conformity to law, for the South west quarter of Section seventeen in Township one North of Range five East of Willamette Meridian in Washington containing one hundred and sixty acres, according to the official Plat of the Survey of said Lands returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now Know Ke that there he, therefore, granted by the United States unto the said Caleb J.Moore the tract of Land above described. To have and to Hold the said Tract of Land, with the appurtenanced thereof, unto the said Caleb J.Moore and to his heirs and assigns forever have subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing or other purposes mand rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs laws and decisions of courts, and also subject to the right of the proprietor of a vein or lode to extract Page 455 andremove his ore therefrom, should the same be found to penetrate or intersect the premises hereby granted as provided by law. And there is reserved from the lands hereby granted as right of way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States.
