THE UNITED STATES to CALEB J. MOORE.

Homestead Certificate No. 2314. Application 7841.

The United States of America: To all to whom these presents shall come Greeting:

Whereas, there has been deposited in the General Land Office at Vancouver, Washington ~~Territory~~, whereby it appears that pursuant to "Act of Congress approved 20th May, 1862, "To secure Homesteads to actual settlers on the Public Domain", and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Caleb J. Moore has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law, for the South west quarter of Section seventeen in Township one North of Range five East of Willamette Meridian in Washington containing one hundred and sixty acres, according to the official Plat of the Survey of said Lands returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now Know Ye that there is, therefore, granted by the United States unto the said Caleb J. Moore the tract of Land above described: To have and to Hold the said Tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Caleb J. Moore and to his heirs and assigns forever, subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs laws and decisions of courts, and also subject to the right of the proprietor of a vein or lode to extract and remove his ore therefrom, should the same be found to penetrate or intersect the premises hereby granted as provided by law. And there is reserved from the lands hereby granted a right of way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States.

In Testimony Whereof, I, Benjamin Harrison President of the United States of America have caused these letters to be made Patent and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
