Water Right; Little White Salmon; Short & Henderson.

Take Notice.

1<sup>st</sup>. That we, Jessie Franklin Short and John Leland Henderson of Hood River, Oregon, claim the water lying, being and flowing in Little White Salmon River, Skamania County, State of Washington to be taken out of said River on the East side thereof, at or near the head of our flume, formerly known as the flume of the Oregon Lumber Company, or or near the North line of Section One (1) of Twp. 3 N. Rg. 9 E. W.M., at or near where said River crosses said line, to the extent of Ten (10) cubic feet of water per second of time.

2<sup>nd</sup>. Said water is appropriated for the purpose of irrigating the land of Little White Salmon Valley, and for domestic purposes therein, and is to be used thereon and therefore and is extra, additional, to and independent of the water right acquired by us from the Oregon Lumber Company for water sufficient to fill the present flume 30 inches wide and 30 inches deep above referred to, and heretofore appropriated and in use for the purposes connected with a flume for fluming and saw-mill purposes.
