

Now Know Ye, That There is, therefore granted by the United States unto the said Christopher Anderson the tract of Land above described, To Have and To Hold the said tract of land, together with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Christopher Anderson and to his heirs and assigns forever; subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing or other purposes and rights of ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged by the Local customs, laws, and decisions of Courts and also subject to the right of the proprietor of a vein or lode to extract and remove his ore therefrom, should the same be found to penetrate or intersect the premises hereby granted as provided by law.

In Testimony Whereof, I, Benjamin Harrison President of the United States of America have caused these letters to be made Patent and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

UNITED STATES TO LENNEL McCROSKEY.

THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA.

To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting: Whereas Lennel McCrosky of Skamania County Washington has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the register of the Land Office at Vancouver Washington whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Lennel McCrosky according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands", and the Acts supplemental thereto, for the East half of the North <sup>West</sup> ~~East~~ quarter and the Lots Numbered one and two of Section Thirty in Township Two North of Range six East of Willamette Meridian in Washington, containing on hundred and fifty <sup>eight</sup> acres and fifty six hundredths of an acre according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands returned to the General Land Office, which said tract has been purchased by the said Lennel McCrosky.

Now Know Ye, That the United States of America in consideration of the premises and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such cases made and provided, have given and granted and by these presents do give and grant unto the said Lennel McCrosky and to his heirs the said tract above described. To Have and To Hold the same together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging unto the said Lennel McCrosky to his heirs and assigns forever; subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, and other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs laws and decisions of Courts and also subject to the right of the proprietor of a vein or lode to extract and remove
