UNITED STATES to LORA A. MOFFETT.

THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA: To all to whom these presents come, Greeting:

WHEREAS, In pursuance of the provisions of the Reserved Statutes of the United States, Chapter Six, Title Thirty-two, and legislation supplemental thereto, there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States the certificate No. 1, of the Register of the Land Office at Vancouver in the Territory of Washington, accompanied by other evidence, whereby it appears that Lora A. Moffett did on the fourth day of September A. D. 1888, duly enter and pay for that certain placer mining claim and premises known as the Lora A. Moffett placer mining claim and described as lot nine of Section sixteen Township two, North of Range seven East, Willamette Meridian, situated in Skamania County, Washington Territory and containing nineteen acres of land more or less. Now Know Ye, That there is therefore hereby granted by the United States unto the said Lora A. Moffett and to her heirs and assigns the said mining premises herein-before described, TO HAVE AND TO HOLD said mining premises together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said grantee above named, and to her heirs and assigns forever, subject nevertheless to the following conditions and stipulations.

First. That the grant hereby made is restricted in its exterior limits to the boundaries of the said mining premises and to any veins or lodes or quartz or other rock in place bearing gold, silver, ^{cinnabar} ~~cinnabar~~, lead, tin, copper, or other valuable deposits which may have discovered within said limits subsequent to and which were not known to exist on the first day of April, A. D. one Thousand eight hundred and eighty six. Second, that

should any vein or lode of quartz or other rock in place bearing gold, silver, ^{cinnabar} ~~cinnabar~~, lead, tin, copper, or other valuable deposits be claimed or known to exist within the above described premises at said last named date the same is expressly excepted and excluded from these presents. THIRD That the premises hereby conveyed may be ^{entered} ~~entered~~ by the proprietor of any vein or lode of quartz or other rock in place bearing gold, silver, cinnabar, lead, tin, copper or other valuable deposits for the purpose of removing the ore from such vein or lode should the same or any part thereof, be found to penetrate
