

Articles of Incorporation of The Washington Lumber Co.

Articles of Incorporation of The Washington Lumber Company, of Okanogan County, State of Washington.

Know all men by these presents:- That we the under-
signed persons, to-wit:- Frank Savenport, Fred Kautz and
F. M. Arnold, of whom F. M. Arnold, is a resident of said
County of Okanogan and State of Washington, and all of
whom are citizens of the United States of America, have as-
sociated ourselves together, under the laws of the State of
Washington relative to Private Corporations, and hereby adopt
the following Articles of Incorporation:-

Article 1. The name of this corporation shall be The Washington
Lumber Company, and its duration shall be fifty years.

Article 2. The object of this corporation and the business in
which it proposes to engage is the manufacture of wood, lum-
ber, telegraph poles, piling, meaning thereby to do a general lumbering
business, whether specifically above set out or not; to purchase
and own wood, timber, lumber or other materials that may be
necessary or convenient to the business of this corporation;
to buy, sell, or in any way deal in lands or hereditaments; to
erect or maintain ware-houses, store-houses, or other buildings
for the purpose of marketing the said manufactured products;
and to carry on said business by selling or otherwise disposing of
the same in said State or by branch establishments in other
States.

Article 3. The Capital Stock of this Corporation is Four
Thousand (\$4000) Dollars, divided into Forty (40) shares of One
hundred (100) Dollars each, par value.

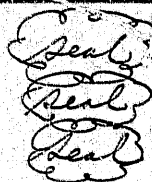
Article 4. The corporate powers of this corporation shall be ex-
ercised by a board of three (3) Trustees or directors, and the trus-
tees who shall exercise said powers for the succeeding six months,
are the incorporators herein, to-wit:- Frank Savenports, Fred Kautz
and F. M. Arnold.

Article 5. The principal place of business of this Corporation
shall be Okanogan's post office, at the Company's mill, in Okan-
ogan County, and State of Washington.
