R. 7 E. W.M., all being in Skamaria County, State of Washington, for labor performed upon and assistance rendered in securing cutting, bucking, logging manufacturing, and hauling the said logs as hereinarter set forth.

That she made of the owner or reputed owner is E. E. Dunlap and P. J. Filmegan, co-partners, d.b.a. Dunlap a Finnegan, and such labor and assistance was performed at the request of the said owners; that the terms and conditions of the employment of each or the claimants, together with the amount of their respective claims, are as follows:

That Frank tankin was employed as rigging can and loader at the agreed wase of 75¢ per hour and performed work and labor upon said logs a total or 236 hours. That said labor and a sistance commenced on the 3rd day of July, 1937, and ended upon the 7th day of August, 1937. The total amount of said claimant's demand is the sum of \$177.00 of which \$42.57 has been paid, leaving a balance of \$134.45 for which sum he claims a lien against said saw logs.
