NOTICE OF LOGGERS' LIEN

Notice is hereby given that W. F. Majors and John Majors, of Cowlitz County, Washington, claim a lien upon a certain quantity of fir saw logs, being about 691,854 board feet in quantity, which were cut and manufactured in Skamania County, State of Washington, and marked thus "O" and "V" and are now lying in Wauhl Brothers' Boom, No. 32, in Martin's Slough, near the Columbia River, about two miles North of Woodland, Cowlitz County, Washington, for labor performed upon and assistance rendered in cutting said saw logs; that the name of the owner or reputed owner of said fir saw logs is Fred Dixon; that said Fred Dixon employed the said W.F. Majors and John Majors to perform such labor and render such assistance upon the following terms and conditions, to-wit:

For the cutting of said saw logs the said Fred Dixon promised and agreed to pay the claimants at the rate of fifty-five cents per 1000 board foot for such saw logs so cut; that said contract has been faithfully performed and fully complied with on the part of said claimants, who performed labor upon and assisted in securing said fir saw logs for the period commencing August 3, 1937 and ending September 11, 1937, and the rendition of said services was closed on the 11st day of September, 1937, and that thirty days have not elapsed since that time; that the amount of claimants' demand for said service so rendered is the sum of \$396.00, upon which there has been paid the sum of \$205.54, leaving a balance due these claimants for such service so rendered the sum of \$190.46.

That no part of said sum of \$190.46 has been paid, and there is now due, owing and remaining unpaid thereon the sum of \$190.46, in which sum these claimants claim a lien upon said fir saw logs.

That said W. F. Majors and John Majors also claim a lien on all said fir saw logs now owned by said Fred Dixon of said county, to secure payment for the work and labor performed in obtaining or securing the said logs, spars, piles or other timber, lumber or shingles herein described.
