

## LOGGER'S LIEN NOTICE

E.J. Edwards, Claimant

vs

W.A. Kemp, R.O. Tompkins and E.O. Samuels,  
doing business under the firm name and  
style of Kemp, Tompkins & Samuels.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that E.J. Edwards of Skamania County, State of Washington, claims a lien upon a quantity of sawed fir railroad ties being about 109000 feet board measure in quantity and about 2400 in number, each tie being 7 x 9 inches square and 8 feet long, unbranded, which were cut or manufactured in Skamania County, State of Washington, are unmarked except as above described, and are now lying in what is known as Greenleaf Slough in Section 16, 20 and 21, Township 2 North of Range 7 East of the Willamette Meridian about one mile in a northwesterly direction from the water tank and station on the Spokane, Portland & Seattle Railway known as Cascade station in said Skamania County, State of Washington, for labor and assistance rendered in and about cutting, sawing, manufacturing, fluming and securing and preparing said railroad ties for market; that the name of the owner, or reputed owner, of said railroad ties is W.A. Kemp, R.O. Tompkins and E.O. Samuels doing business as a partnership under the firm name and style of Kemp, Tompkins & Samuels; said Kemp, Tompkins and Samuels employed said E.J. Edwards to perform such labor and render such assistance upon the following terms and conditions, to-wit:

Was to pay claimant \$2.50 per day and hold out 5.25 per week for board, that said contract has been faithfully performed and fully complied with on the part of said E.J. Edwards who performed labor upon and assisted in and about cutting, sawing, manufacturing, fluming and securing and preparing said railroad ties for market for the period of 24 days that said labor and services were so performed and rendered upon said railroad ties between the 6th day of August 1914, and the 10th day of September 1914, and the rendition of said service was closed on the 9th day of September, 1914, and thirty days have not elapsed since that time; that the amount of claimants demand for said services is \$60.00; that no part thereof has been paid except the sum of \$28.50, and there is now due and remaining unpaid thereon, after deducting all just credits and offsets, the sum of \$32.50, in which amount he claims a lien upon said fir railroad ties. The said E.J. Edwards also claims a lien on all said railroad ties now owned by said Kemp, Tompkins & Samuels of said County to secure payment for work and labor performed in obtaining or securing said timber products herein described.
