

Notice of Location "The Copper Bronze" Lode

Beginning at the Discovery situated at the entrance of what was once known as the Jamison prospect Tunnel Location notice placed in the same ten Can with the Montana location. The north west end of the Copper Bronze Lode begins at the South East end of the Montana Lode claim and runs 1500 linear feet south 45° East magnetic to center or End stake and then three hundred feet at right angles on each side from each center stake to corner stake at each 4 corners, embracing 1500 x 600 feet and includes the grounds formerly known as the Jamison Camp, was discovered in 1895 & became delinquent in 1897 and was a part of the Jamison Group of claims and is now relocated by the undersigned and will hereafter be known as a part of the Montana Group is situated at what is properly the lower end of what was once known as Jamison Gulch is on the south side and near the base of Star Mountain of which forms the East end of Goat Mountain Range.
