The South half of the North East Quarter and the North half of the South East Quarter of section Two (2) in Township one (1) North of Range five (5) east of the Willamette River containing one hundred and fifty acres and being situated in the County of Skamania Washington Territory. Together with the Tenements hereditaments and Appurtenances thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining to have and to hold the same with the Appurtenances unto the said Thomas Popham his heirs and assigns forever. This Conveyance is intended as a Mortgage to secure the payment of the sum of one thousand Dollars and the interest thereon in accordance with the tenor of a certain promissory note of which the following is a copy two mill \$1,000.00.
