

## WASHOUGAL GOLD &amp; COPPER MINING CO. TO MASTERSON.

Notice is hereby given that the undersigned, Miller Masterson, at the request of the Washougal Gold & Copper Mining Co., a mining corporation organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of South Dakota, having its principal place of business at Huron, South Dakota, and being duly authorized by the State of Washington to transact business in said State of Washington, having established a business office at the said Mining Company's property in Skamania County, Washington, the nearest postoffice being Cape Horn, Washington; in the possession of owning, prospecting and developing its mineral claims situated as aforesaid in Skamania County, Washington, to-wit: among other claims known and registered by and under the following names. Copper King; Golden Bug; Gold King; Violin; Fren; Golden Eagle; Evening Star; Dixie; Queen; Silver Cup; Copper Queen; Copper Heights; Twin Baby; Hot Stuff and Patsie, upon which is situated and located the following personal property. A power house plant and the following items of mining machinery, and equipment. 2 40 H.p. boilers, 1 60 h.p. 13x15 steam Engines, 1 12x12x7x12 Ingersol -Rand belt driven Air Compressor, 36" Pelton Waterwheel, capable of developing 60 h.p. when operated under a head of 300' and employing a 1-3/8" nozzle, 1 Connellsville Blower, displacement per revolution 17 cubic feet, 1 Air receiver, 4x8, 300 feet of double riveted 12" pipe, 1 6x8 geared hoist, No. 9 New Sinking Pump, Boiler feed pump, Shaft pump, a full complement of small tools, A blacksmith shop well equipped for the

purpose, a concentrating mill containing the following equipment: 1 7x10 Blake Crusher capacity 50 tons, 24 hrs., 2 Nissen Stamps, 15 tons, 24 hours, 1 Pierce Amalgamator, 1 Cone Classifier, 1 Wilfley Table, 20-40 ton capacity, 1 Frue Vanner, 20-25 tons, 1 200 light dynamo, 1 40 h.p. Steam Engine, Pulleys, belts and other small tools incident to a plant of this sort. Together with bunk houses, mess house, office buildings, etc., and on which claim there has been done a considerable amount of development work; commenced to perform labor for said mining company upon its property and in the preservation of its personal property and franchise on the first day of March, 1915, (so far as the time covered by this lien is concerned although said Miller Masterson worked for said mining Company for a long time prior to March 1, 1915, but has been paid in full up to said date of March 1, 1915) and has at said mining Company's request since said date of March 1, 1915 been continuously performing labor for said company upon its mining property aforesaid and the preservation and care of its personal property from said date until the first day of December, 1915, upon the following terms and conditions, to-wit:

To be paid Seventy five Dollars (\$75.00) for the month of March, 1915, Seventy Five Dollars (\$75.00) for the month of April, 1915; Seventy Five Dollars (\$75.00) for the month of May, 1915; Seventy Five Dollars (\$75.00) for the month of June, 1915; Seventy Five Dollars (\$75.00) for the month of July, 1915; Seventy Five Dollars (\$75.00) for the month of August 1915; Seventy Five Dollars (\$75.00) for the month of September, 1915; Seventy Five Dollars (\$75.00) for the month of October 1915; and Seventy Five Dollars (\$75.00) for the month

of November, 1915.

That the claimant is still employed by said Company but is filing this Claim of Lien to cover for the period March 1, 1915, to December 1, 1915, this claim being for nine full months' time; that claimant has not been paid anything for the labor performed by him during said period of March 1, 1915, to December 1, 1915, That there is now due and owing to claimant, Miller Masterson, from the Washougal Gold & Copper Mining Co. aforesaid the sum of Six Hundred Seventy Five Dollars (\$675.00) for labor performed from March 1, 1915, to December 1, 1915, at the rate of \$75.00 per month as above stated after deducting all just credits and off-sets.

That claimant was employed by the officials of said Washougal Gold & Copper Mining Company authorized to contract with him and pay the sums of money aforesaid for the performance of the labor performed as aforesaid. That claimant claims a lien upon the mining claims hereinbefore named for labor performed as stated: Copper King; Golden Bug; Gold King; Violin; Fren; Golden Eagle; Evening Star; Dixie Queen; Silver Cup; Copper Queen; Copper Heights; Twin Baby; Hot Stuff; and Patsie, all situated in Skamania County, Washington, and upon the following personal property of the Washougal Gold & Copper Mining Company listed above and as follows:

2 40 h.p. boilers, 1 60 h.p. 13x15 Steam Engines, 1 12x12x7½x12 Ingersoll-Rand belt driven Air Compressor, 1 36" Pelton Waterwheel, capable of developing 60 h.p. when operated under a head of 300' and employing a 1-3/8" nozzle, 1 Connelville Blower, displacement per revolution 17 cubic feet, 1 Air receiver, 4x8, 300 feet of double-riveted 12" pipe, 1 6x8 geared hoist, 1 No. 9 New Sinking Pump Boiler feed pump, Shaft pump, A full complement of small tools, A blacksmith shop well equipped for the purpose.

1 7x10 Blake Crusher, capacity 50 tons, 24 hrs. 2 Misen Clamps, 15 tons, 24 hours., 1 Pierce Amalgamator, 1 Cons Classifier, 1 Wilfley Table, 20-40 ton capacity, 1 Frue Vanner, 20-25 tons, 1 200 light dynamo, 1 40 h.p. steam Engine, Pulleys, belts and other small tools incident to a plant of this sort, Together with the franchise or franchises of the Washougal Gold & Copper Mining Company, in the sum of Six hundred Seventy Five Dollars (\$675.00) for labor performed upon said mining claims and for the care and preservation of said mining Company's personal property used in connection with the operation and development of said mining claims and in connection with its franchises. That ninety days have not elapsed since claimant ceased performing labor for as stated claimant is still in the employ of said mining company. That claimant was employed by and at the special instance and request of the Washougal Gold & Copper Mining Company, acting therein by F.A. Mabee its President, said Mabee being duly authorized to contract with him such official and to bind the said company to pay the sums of money aforesaid for the performance of the labor as above set forth and furthermore the \$75.00 per month is a reasonable amount to be charged for the services rendered.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Eva Anders of Skamania County, Washington, claims a lien upon that certain sawmill and saw mill business situated on lots 1 and 2 and the West half of the north east quarter of Section 17, Township 2 North of Range 7 East of the Willamette Meridian, in Skamania County, State of Washington, together with all boiler saws, belting, machinery, flumes, landing, roadways, donkey engines and equipments, tools implements and equipments of every kind and nature in and about or used in connection with said sawmill and all the real and personal property of said D.J. Finn and Walter S. Kilgore and Augusta Kilgore, his wife, which is used in the operation of, or in connection with, said sawmill and sawmill business including all the standing and cut timber on said described lands and about 500 7x9 8 ft. in length sawed fir railroad ties piled on the Spokane, Portland & Seattle Railway's right of way at or near the water tank at Cascades station of said railway in Skamania County, Washington, about 150 7x8 8 feet long sawed fir railway ties at said mill, about 200000 feet, board measure, fir saw logs in the woods on said land prepared for use in said mill, about 1500 board measure, timbers at said mill and about 22000 feet, board measure, fir sawlogs at said mill, for work and labor performed in and about said sawmill and sawmill business; that the amount of claimant's demand for said work and labor, after deducting all just credits and offsets, is \$68.00 that the names of the persons owning and operating said sawmill and sawmill business are D.J. Finn and Walter S. Kilgore and Augusta Kilgore, husband and wife; that the names of the person employing this claimant is Walter S. Kilgore on behalf of himself and the other said owners; that claimant states the terms and conditions of his contract to be that said owners employed this claimant to labor in said sawmill at the agreed wage of \$40.00 per month and board; that she commenced said work on the 6th day of March 1916, that she worked, pursuant to the terms of said contract 1 month and 21 days, which, at said agreed wage, amounted to the sum of \$68.00; that the date of her last service
