To all to whom these Presents shall Come Greeting:
Whereas Pluma Leavens of Channania County Washington Territory has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Vancouver whereby it appears that Full Payment has been made by the said Pluma Leavens according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April 1820 entitled an act making further provision for the sale of the Public lands for the Lot numbered one of Section Three in Township One North and the Lots numbered Two and Three of section Thirty Seven in Township Two North of Range Four East, in the District of lands subject to sale at Vancouver Washington Territory containing fifty five acres and seventy five hundredths of an acre according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said lands returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said Tracts have been purchased by the said Pluma Leavens.

Now Know Ye That the United States of America, in Consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such Case made and provided Have Given and Granted, and by these presents Do Give and Grant, unto the said Pluma Leavens, her heirs the said Tracts above described; Do Have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, therunto belonging, unto the said Pluma Leavens and to her heirs and assigns forever.
